

Erasmus Policy Statement (EPS)

The European University of Law and Administration in Warsaw [EULA] was established on the basis of:

- 1) the decision of the Minister of National Education dated September 19, 1997,
- 2) the founding act,
- 3) entry in the register of non-state universities of the Ministry of Education dated October 13, 1997. - item number 137.

The founder of EULA is the Warsaw Association of Polish Lawyers. At the stage of the establishment of the University, the Founder closely cooperated with the Institute of Legal Sciences of the Polish Academy of Sciences, among others, in the following areas: construction of the first study programs, and in subsequent years Institute of Law Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences supported EULA with its scientific staff in the didactic process. At present, in accordance with the Development Strategy, the University has a fully autonomous, highly qualified staff of its own, consisting of both academic professors and practitioners working in the industries they teach.

We plan to participate in Erasmus+ actions in the future in following types of Erasmus+ activities are open to HEIs:

- Key Action 1 (KA1)
- Key Action 2 (KA2)
- Jean Monnet Actions

EULA has the following departments/pilots:

- 1) Faculty in Warsaw, which conducts a single master's degree program in Law and a bachelor's degree program in Internal Security.
- 2) Faculty in London, which runs a single master's degree program in Law (launched in October 2011)
- 3) Faculty in Brussels, which provides bachelor's degree studies in the field of European Administration (launched in October 2016).

The mission of the EULA is to educate students in the area of social sciences, with particular emphasis on legal sciences and related disciplines, which also include Security Sciences, including, undoubtedly, internal security. The University's primary activity in implementing this premise is to educate lawyers and public administration employees who combine professionalism with axiological sensitivity. The University educates graduates who effectively solve professional problems, and at the same time are able to neutralize any conflicts of interest in a conciliatory while at the same time being able to neutralize any conflicts of interest in a conciliatory manner.

The university has a department in Brussels aimed at cooperation with the bodies of the European Union, and EWSPA students are encouraged to undertake internships in European Union institutions. The goal of the university is to develop education and research in the area of European Union studies

The above-mentioned fundamental assumptions about the didactic process are to shape the university graduate in such a way that in his professional practice he is characterized by effectiveness in resolving disputes while maintaining the ability to function in society with respect for different cultures, attitudes, ideologies and views.

EULA graduates should have the ability to combine theory with its practical application, as well as the ability to function in a socially and culturally diverse society. EULA is a University that not only develops knowledge and skills, but also shapes the attitudes of its graduates. EULA is one of the oldest non-public universities operating continuously in Poland and abroad for more than two decades.

Participation in Erasmus+ Programme is a very important part of the strategy of development

and internationalisation of European University of Law and Administration in Warsaw [EULA] The long-term strategy of our institution treats international mobility of students and staff and cooperation as a priority for modernization and our presence on the international educational arena.

The University serves civil society by building an attitude of activity, responsibility and commitment to the common good. This strategy indicates a very high level of compliance of the university's priorities and principles and Erasmus in a very wide range of activities of the university. Thus, the participation of universities in the Erasmus programme will contribute both to the universal objectives of the program and the construction of the European Education Area, as well as to the implementation of the university's objectives, its modernization, improvement and implementation of the development strategy. In detail, the strategy indicates the need to intensify the process of internationalisation of research and education as one of the key tasks. The strategy assumes the need to attract outstanding scientists and students from all over the world who want to pursue themselves within the university walls.

Strategy, objectives and impact

EULA emphasize very important role of English language, as a main way of communication in the global world. Throughout many supplementary forms of education academic teachers and administrative staff are raising their qualifications for example: language courses, post diploma studies, doctoral studies etc.

Up till now we have established bilateral agreements with foreign partners institutions. International cooperation is very important part of university strategy. Quality and high level of mobility is also very significant goal. Financial support from European funds will help to organize mobility. To comply with basics Erasmus rules, university pays attention to the non-discrimination rules; any signs of racism, xenophobia, prejudice because of gender, nationality, disability or religion will be treated as the violation of human rights. To achieve social and economic cohesion of EU, European University of Law and Administration i Warsaw will take all possible measures to develop cooperation with industry, business, labour market, community and local and regional authorities.

The most important target groups are students (study and practice placements mobility) and staff (teaching and training mobility). ECTS system is implemented in all fields of study as the main device to facilitate international exchange. Course catalogs and learning outcomes descriptions are updated and posted on the website. Full mobility recognition is provided for satisfactory completed Erasmus outgoing students exchange. The EULA ensures full recognition and credit for all positively assessed subjects that the student attended during the study period abroad. Information on participation in mobility is also contained in the supplement to the diploma of graduation. The university provides support in the process of preparation and organization of every student and staff mobility. Equal treatment is provided for all participants of mobility. Integration is very important element of Erasmus mobility.

Also the offer of cooperation for incoming students, lecturers and administrative employees of partner universities is open. No fees for tuition will be charged from incoming Erasmus students. The . EULA provides students with no other fees for registration or exam and libraries.

In order to ensure adequate visibility of the Erasmus University Charter, the Erasmus Policy Statement and the Erasmus program, advertising and information for the academic and local community, companies and other institutions will be widely disseminated on the university website. The university ensures the promotion of the program in social media and the participation of local ambassadors, i.e. students and employees who have completed the mobility, in meetings with potential

candidates for mobility, as well as including incoming students and staff from partner universities in activities to promote the Program.

We plan to follow cooperation projects for innovation and good practice, which are element of institutional internationalization and modernization strategy; enterprises, staff mobility, knowledge alliance between HEI and business.

Due to participation in Erasmus+ Programme there will be stronger connection between education, research, business, which is very important for creation new fields of studies and development of our institution; there will be higher number of population with higher education diploma. Improving the quality of education by adapting to the curricula new requirements of changing economy, business, labour market and information collected by International Cooperation Department. Strengthening education quality through mobility and international cooperation; mobility helps students and staff increase their professional skills, get new experience, obtain wide social skills and be able to function in multicultural societies.

Indicators

The university aims to activate employees and students as much as possible and increase the number of mobility while maintaining high quality and continuous improvement of the exchange. The level of quality of the activities carried out and the satisfaction of individual participants will be constantly monitored. The aim is to maintain quality requirements above satisfactory and full support for mobility participants.

This Programme will help in both forming proper tolerance attitude and shaping intercultural competencies in local communities. Sharing experiences and forming new social relations is crucial in establishing a sense of community. Promoting social inclusion is essential for sustainable development on a local, regional, and international level. The opportunity to participate in the Programme will not only promote the multicultural character of the University, but will also introduce the culture of other countries to the mobility participants and local community.

Every society needs knowledge, exchange of experience and cooperation so that it can develop. The highest quality of education and continuous development of the university's community are a response to the needs of the modern economy and society.
